A little boy turns the house of a lonely old couple upside down by insisting he was a rat.

Spinelli, Jerry. **Wringer**

Palmer must either accept the violence of being a wringer at his town's annual Pigeon Day or find the courage to oppose it.

Talbert, Marc. **The Trap**

Ellie attempts to avenge the death of her cat by a coyote, but traps and injures a neighbor's dog instead.

A curious young raccoon takes an unexpected trip downstream in a small wooden boat.

Bang, Molly. **Goose**

Adopted by woodchucks at birth, a baby goose never feels she truly belongs until the day she discovers she can fly.

Banks, Kate. **The Bird, the Monkey and the Snake in the Jungle**

A rebus tells the story about a bird, a monkey and a snake who go looking for a new home and encounter various jungle animals on the way.

Blackstone, Stella. **There's a Cow in the Cabbage Patch**

All the animals in this mixed-up farmyard are out of place, but when dinnertime comes around, suddenly they are all back where they belong.

Brett, Jan. **The Hat**

When Lisa hangs her woolen clothes in the sun to air them out for winter, the hedgehog, to the amusement of the other animals, ends up wearing a stocking on his head.

Bruss, Deborah. **Book! Book! Book!**

When the children go back to school, the animals on the farm are bored, so they visit the town library trying to find something to do.

Falwell, Cathryn. **Turtle Splash! Countdown at the Pond**

As they are startled by the activities of other nearby creatures, the number of turtles on a log in a pond decreases from ten to one.

Feiffer, Jules. **Bark, George!**

When George's mother instructs him to bark, the lovable puppy answers with a "meow" and other animal sounds.

Fleming, Candace. **Muncha! Muncha! Muncha!**

After planting the garden he has dreamed of for years, Mr. McGreely tries to find a way to keep some persistent bunnies from eating all his vegetables.

Garrett, Ann. **What's for Lunch?**

Simple, humorous rhymes describe what pandas, monkeys and other animals eat for lunch.

Graham, Bob. **Queenie, One of the Family**

Caitlin and her parents rescue a hen and take her home with them, but even after they return her to the farm, her presence is still felt in the little girl's family.

Hassett, John and Ann. **Cat Up a Tree**

With rapidly increasing numbers of cats stuck in her tree, Nana Quimby asks for help from the firehouse, the police, the pet shop, the zoo, the library, and even city hall.

Hindley, Judy. **Do Like a Duck Does!**

By challenging a hairy stranger to imitate the behavior of herself and her ducklings, a mother duck proves that he is a fox and not a duck.

Lawrence, John. **This Little Chick**

A little chick shows that he can make the sounds of the animals in his neighborhood.

Leslie, Amanda. **Flappy, Waggy, Wiggly**

In this peek-a-boo riddle book, simple questions lead the reader to guess what animal can be found when the page is turned.

McFarland, Lyn Rossiter. **Widget**

A small stray dog is accepted into a household full of cats by learning to "fit in", but when his mistress is hurt, he demonstrates that being a dog is not all bad.

Root, Phyllis. **One Duck Stuck**

In this counting book, increasingly larger groups of animals try to help a duck that is stuck in the sleepy, slimy marsh.

Rylant, Cynthia. **The Great Gracie Chase: Stop That Dog!**

A cumulative tale about a small dog named Gracie whose quiet life is disrupted by some noisy painters.

Simont, Marc. **The Stray Dog: From a True Story by Reiko Sassa**

A family befriends a stray dog, names him Willy, and decides to keep him.

Yaccarino, Dan. **Deep in the Jungle**

After being tricked into joining the circus, an arrogant lion escapes and returns to the jungle where he lives peacefully with the animals he used to terrorize.

Haas, Jessie. **Runaway Radish**

When Judy, and then Nina, outgrow their pony, the perfect solution is found after Radish runs away.

LaMarche, Jim. **The Raft**

When Nicky spends a summer with grandma, she introduces him to rafting and observing the animals of the woods and river.

McDermott, Gerald. **The Fox and the Stork**

In this fable, the stork outwits the fox that tricks him.

Minters, Frances. **Chicken for a Day**

One morning Daisy wakes up and finds she has turned into a chicken.

Rylant, Cynthia. **Henry and Mudge and Annie's Perfect Pet**

George, Jean Craighead. **Frightful's Mountain**

Frightful, a peregrine falcon, interacts with humans and animals. (series)

Hall, Elizabeth. **Child of the Wolves**

Hiassen, Carl. **Hoot**
