Atwater-Rhodes, Amelia. *Demon in my View*. Dell Laurel-Leaf, 2000. (7-12)  
Seventeen-year-old Jessica Allodola discovers that the vampire world of her fiction is real when she develops relationships with an alluring vampire named Aubrey and the teenage witch who is trying to save Jessica from his clutches.

Atwater-Rhodes, Amelia. *Into the Forests of the Night*. Dell Laurel-Leaf, 1999. (7-12)  
Risika, a teenage vampire, wanders back in time to the year 1684 when, as a human, she died and was transformed against her will.

Atwater-Rhodes, Amelia. *Midnight Predator*. Dell Laurel-Leaf, 2002. (7-12)  
Vampire hunter Turquoise Draka goes undercover as a human slave in order to enter the fabled vampire realm of Midnight and assassinate Jeshikah, one of the cruelest vampires in history, but her guise brings up old memories of her past enslavement and she finds herself comforted by her benign master Jaguar.

Atwater-Rhodes, Amelia. *Shattered Mirror*. Delacorte Press, 2001 (7-12)  
As seventeen-year-old Sarah, daughter of a powerful line of vampire-hunting witches, continues to pursue the ancient bloodsucker Nikolas, she finds herself in a dangerous friendship with two vampire siblings in her high school.

Atwater-Rhodes, Amelia. *The Persistence of Memory*. Delacorte Press, 2008. (9-12)  
Diagnosed with schizophrenia as a child, sixteen-year-old Erin has spent half of her life in therapy and on drugs, but now must face the possibility of weird things in the real world, including shapeshifting friends and her "alter," a centuries-old vampire.

Armstrong, Kelley. *Darkest Powers Series*. HarperCollins (8-12)  
Chloe Saunders is haunted by a particularly violent ghost and is sent to Lyle House, a center for disturbed teens, where she finds herself investigating a series of other paranormal happenings. Includes *The Summoning* (2008) and *The Awakening* (2009).

Becker, Tom. *Darkside*. Orchard Books, 2007. (6-12)

Jonathan Starling's father is in an asylum and his home has been attacked. When running away from kidnappers, he stumbles upon Darkside, a terrifying and hidden part of London ruled by the descendants of Jack the Ripper. Sequels – *Lifeblood* (2008), *Nighttrap* (2009) & *Timecurse* (2009).

Bassye, Dale. *Heck: where the bad kids go*. Random House, 2008. (5-9)

When timid Milton and his older, scofflaw sister Marlo die in a marshmallow bear explosion at Grizzly Mall, they are sent to Heck, an otherworldly reform school from which they are determined to escape.

Barlow, Toby. *Sharp Teeth*. HarperCollins, 2008. (9-12)

Dogcatcher, Anthony, has no idea that his girlfriend is a werewolf who has abandoned her pack, but her efforts to keep her secret lead to murderous results

Bruchac, Joseph. *The Dark Pond*. HarperTrophy, 2004. (5-10)

After he feels a mysterious pull drawing him toward a dark, shadowy pond in the woods, Arnie looks to old Native American tales for guidance about the dangerous monster lurking in the water.

Bruchac, Joseph. *Skeleton Man*. HarperCollins, 2001. (5-10)

After her parents disappear and she is turned over to the care of a strange "great-uncle," Molly must rely on her dreams about an old Mohawk story for her safety and maybe even for her life. Sequel is *The Return of Skeleton Man* (2008)

Cabot, Meg. *The Mediator Series*. Avon Books, 2005.

A girl. A guy. A new kind of ghost story! Susannah Simon is a mediator--it isn't easy being a mediator--that is someone who can see and speak to the dead--especially when you'd rather be at the outlet mall or snagging your first boyfriend. But what if the ghost of a really hot guy haunts you? Includes *Shadowland*, *The Ninth Key*, *Reunion*, *The Darkest Hour*, *Haunted* and *Twilight*.

Cabot, Meg. ed. *Prom Nights from Hell*. HarperTeen, 2007. (8-12)

Contains five stories of prom nights populated by vampires, demons, and the grim reaper, including selections by Meg Cabot, Kim Harrison, Michele Jaffe, Stephenie Meyer, and Lauren Myracle. The exterminator's daughter / Meg Cabot -- The corsage / Lauren Myracle -- Madison Avery and the dim reaper / Kim Harrison -- Kiss and tell / Michele Jaffe -- Hell on Earth / Stephenie Meyer.

Caine, Rachel. *Morganville Vampire Series*. Nal Jam Books, 2006. (9-12)

College student Claire Danvers begins having trouble with the popular girls in the dorms and decides to rent a room in an old house off campus, where her roommates are stranger than she is but willing to protect her from the undead that run the town. Includes *Glass Houses* (2006) *The Dead Girls' Dance* (2007), *Midnight Alley* (2007), *Feast of Fools* (2008), *Lord of Misrule* (2008), *Carpe Corpus* (2009) and *Fade Out* (2009).

Cary, Kate. *Bloodline : a novel*. Razorbill, 2005. (10-12)  
Nineteen-year-old John Shaw returns from World War One and is haunted by nightmares of not only the battles but the horrifying discovery that his regimental commander is descended from Count Dracula. Sequel is *Reckoning: a novel* (2006).

Cast. P. C. & Kristen Cast. *House of Night Series*. St. Martin's Griffin. (9-12)  
After being accepted as a fledgling vampire at the House of Night prep school and receiving special powers by a goddess, sixteen-year-old Zoey Montgomery discovers one of her peers is misusing her powers and must decide what the right thing to do is. Her adventures and discoveries that all is not right in the House of Night continue in the sequels. Includes *Marked* (2007), *Betrayed* (2007), *Chosen* (2008), *Untamed* (2008) *Hunted* (2008) & *Tempted* (2009).

Clare, Cassandra. *Mortal Instruments Series*. Margaret K. McElderry Books. (8-12)  
Suddenly able to see demons and the Darkhunters who are dedicated to returning them to their own dimension, fifteen-year-old Clary Fray is drawn into this bizarre world when her mother disappears and Clary herself is almost killed by a monster. Includes *City of Bones* (2007), *City of Ashes* (2008) & *City of Glass* (2009)

Colfer, Eoin. *The Wish List*. Hyperion Books For Children, 2003. (6-10)  
Orphan Meg Finn's soul becomes the object of a battle between the demonic and the divine after she is killed in an accidental explosion while attempting to rob an elderly man and arrives in the afterlife to find the tally on her good and evil deeds is dead even.

Conrad, Liza. *High School Bites: the Lucy Chronicles*. Nal Jam Books, 2006. (7-12)  
Having learned on her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday that Count Dracula exists and lives on her hometown of Seattle, Lucy tries to save herself and her friends while wondering whether her boyfriend is also a vampire.

De La Cruz, Melissa. *Blue Bloods Series*. Hyperion Paperbacks, 2006. (8-12)  
Schuyler Van Alen, a loner at a prestigious New York City private school, sets out to learn the secrets of the Blue Bloods, an ancient group of vampires. Includes *Blue Bloods* (2006), *Masquerade* (2007), *Revelations* (2008) and *The Van Alen Legacy* (2009).

Diver, Lucienne. *Vamped*. Flux, 2009. (8-12)  
After being turned into a vampire, Gina realizes that she, along with many other students from her high school, have become pawns in an uprising within the vampire world

Dunkle, Clare. *By These Ten Bones*. Henry Holt, 2005. (6-10)  
After a mysterious young wood-carver with a horrifying secret arrives in her small Scottish town, Maddie gains his trust--and his heart--and seeks a way to save both him and her townspeople from an ancient evil.

Enthoven, Sam. *The Black Tattoo*. Razorbill, 2006. (8-12)  
When his best friend, Charlie, is possessed by an ancient demon, fourteen-year-old Jack, accompanied by Esme, a girl with superhuman powers, battles all over London and into Hell to save him.

Flesh, Chris. *Pretty Freakin Scary Series*. Grosset & Dunlap. (5-9)  
Franklin Ripp dies young but can earn a second chance at life if he kisses his crush, Lilly Weezbrock, before the end of the school year--however, his supposedly simple task grows complicated when he begins asking questions and uncovers a disturbing secret plot in town. Includes *You Smell Dead: a Novel (2007)*, *Me So Pretty!: a Novel (2007)*, *The Mystery of the Mystery Meat: a Novel (2008)* and *Been There, Crossed Over (2008)*.

French, Jackie. *My Uncle the Werewolf*. Stone Arch Books, 2005. (2-6)  
Buster hires a private detective to find his missing parents when Uncle Wal takes over the werewolf pack and tries to make them act like humans.

Gaiman, Neil. *The Graveyard Book*. HarperCollins, 2008. (6-10)  
The orphan Bod, short for Nobody, is taken in by the inhabitants of a graveyard as a child of eighteen months and raised lovingly and carefully to the age of eighteen years by the community of ghosts and otherworldly creatures.

Grabenstrein, Chris. *The Crossroads*. Random, 2008. (5-9)  
When eleven-year-old Zack Jennings moves to Connecticut with his father and new stepmother, they must deal with the ghosts left behind by a terrible accident, as well as another kind of ghost from Zack's past.

Grahame-Smith Seth & Jane Austin. *Pride and Prejudice and Zombies : the Classic Regency Romance--now with ultraviolent zombie mayhem*. Quirk Books, 2009. (10-12)  
An adaptation of "Pride and Prejudice," in which Meryton is overrun with zombies and Elizabeth Bennet does what must be done to rid the world of the flesh-eating fiends, but she is distracted by the arrival of Mr. Darcy, a rich man who harbors an air of arrogance.

Gray, Claudia. *Evernight Series*. HarperTeen, 2008. (7-12)  
Sixteen-year-old Bianca, a new girl at the sinister Evernight boarding school, finds herself drawn to another outsider, Jared, but dark forces threaten to tear them apart and destroy Bianca's entire world. Includes *Evernight (2008)* *Stargazer (2009)*, *Hourglass (2010)* & *Afterlife (2011)*.

Greenburg, Dan. *My Teacher Ate my Homework*. Grosset & Dunlap, 2002. (2-6)  
After she eats his homework, ten-year-old Zack suspects that his substitute teacher Mrs. Wolfowitz is a werewolf and uncovers her bizarre secret. (Part of the Zack Files series)

Greenberg, Dan. *Secrets of Dripping Fang Series*. Harcourt. (3-7)  
Chronicles the humorous exploits between the orphan twins, Wally and Cheyenne Shluffnuffin, and the evil Onts. Includes *The Onts (2005)*, *Treachery and Betrayal st Jolly Days (2006)*, *The Vampire's Curse (2006)*, *Fall of the House of Mandible (2006)*, *The Shluffmuffin Boy is History (2006)*, *Attack of the Giant Octopus (2007)*, *Please Don't Eat the Children (2007)* & *When Bad Snakes Attach Good Children (2008)*.

Hahn, Mary Downing. *All the Lovely Bad Ones: a Ghost Story*. Clarion Books, 2008. (5-10)

Travis and his sister Corey decide to boost business at their grandmother's Vermont inn by staging a few "hauntings" that soon draw tourists from across the country. In the process their antics awaken a dark force and they must find a way to put to rest the ghosts they have disturbed.

Hawthorne, Rachel. *Dark Guardian Series*. HarperTeen, 2009. (8-12)

While working as a wilderness guide in the national forest where her parents were killed twelve years earlier, seventeen-year-old Kayla is powerfully drawn to Lucas, who she learns is her appointed guardian--and much more--as she discovers her true identity and destiny. Includes *Moonlight* (2009), *Full Moon* (2009) & *Dark of the Moon* (2009).

Hightman, J.P. *Spirit*. HarperTeen, 2008. (9-12)

A story about ghosts and witchcraft as ghost hunters Tess and Tobias board a train for Blackthorne, near Salem.

Horowitz, Anthony. *The Complete Horowitz Horror*. Puffin Books, 2008.

Previously published as Horowitz horror and More Horowitz horror." Presents a collection of eighteen horror stories, set in England, that focus on everyday items that have sinister qualities, and includes computer games, a mysterious elevator, and a deadly cell phone.

Horowitz, Anthony. *Horowitz Horror :Stories You'll Wish You'd Never Read*. Philomel Books, 2006, 1999 (5-10)

Bath night -- Killer camera -- Light moves -- The night bus -- Harriet's horrible dream -- Scared -- A career in computer games -- The man with the yellow face -- The monkey's ear. Nine horror stories set in England focus on everyday items that have sinister qualities.

Horowitz, Anthony. *More Horowitz Horror : More Stories You'll Wish You'd Never Read*. Philomel Books, c2000. (5-10)

The shortest horror story ever written. A collection of eight horror stories about a strange hitchhiker, a mysterious elevator, a deadly cellular phone, and other sinister things -- includes The hitchhiker -- The sound of murder -- Burned -- Flight 715 -- Howard's end -- The elevator -- The phone goes dead -- Twist cottage.

Howe, James. *Bunnacula Series*. Atheneum Books for Young Readers. (4-8)

The madcap tales of the beloved vampire bunny, Bunnacula, and his animal pals, Harold, Chester, and Howie. Includes *Bunnacula, a Rabbit Tale Mystery* (1979), *Howliday Inn* (1982), *The Celery Stalks at Midnight* (1983), *Night-Nightmare* (1987), *Bunnacula Strikes Again* (1991), *Return to Howliday Inn* (1992) and *Bunnacula Meets Edgar Allan Crow* (2006).

Hurley, Tonya. *Ghostgirl*. Little Brown, 2008. (6-10)

Charlotte Usher has always struggled to fit in at her high school, and when Charlotte finds herself living in a parallel spiritual world after choking to death on a gummy bear, she tries to reconnect with the physical world while making new friends at her new school for the dead. Sequel is *Ghostgirl : Homecoming (2009)*.

James, Brian. *Zombie Blondes*. Feiwel & Friends. 2008. (7-12)

Each time fifteen-year-old Hannah and her out-of-work father move she has some fears about making friends, but a classmate warns her that in Maplecrest, Vermont, the cheerleaders really are monsters.

Jenkins, A. M. *Night Road*. Harper, 2008. (8-12)

Cole, a hemovore who feeds off of human blood, is asked to take another heme out for training, but, Gordon, his new charge, is having difficulty leaving his old life behind and his actions soon threaten them both.

Jinks, Catherine. *The Reformed Vampire Support Group*. Harcourt, 2009. (7-12)

Fifteen-year-old vampire Nina has been stuck for fifty-one years in a boring support group for vampires, and nothing exciting has ever happened to them--until one of them is murdered and the others must try to solve the crime.

Johnson, Maureen. *Devilish*. Razorbill, 2007. (8-12)

Jane Jarvis, a senior at a Catholic girl's school in Providence, Rhode Island, tries to save her best friend by making a pact with a demon.

Jones, Carrie. *Need*. Bloomsbury, 2009. (7-12)

Depressed after the death of her stepfather, high school junior Zara goes to live with her grandmother in a small Maine town, where new friends tell Zara the strange man she keeps seeing may be a pixie king, and that only "were" creatures can stop him from taking souls.

Jones, Patrick. *The Tear Collector*. Walker & Co., 2009. (7-12)

As one of an ancient line of creatures who gain energy from human tears, seventeen-year-old Cassandra offers sympathy to anyone at her school or the hospital where she works, but she yearns to be fully human for the boy she loves, even if it means letting her family down.

Kagesaki, Yuna. *Chibi Vampire*. Tokyopop, 2006

Translated from the Japanese - book reads from right to left. Karin, an unusual child vampire who has blood to spare, aspires to donate blood to humans rather than steal it, but unfortunately things never seem to work out as she plans. There are 11 books in this series.

Kenner, Julie. *Fendi, Ferragamo & Fangs*. Berkley Jam, 2007. (9-12)  
Presents, one continuous story, different points of view of Vamp modeling Inc., as three teens are selected to be groomed as supermodels, unaware that success depends on their becoming vampires.

Klaus, Annette Curtis. *Blood and Chocolate*. Delacorte Press, 2007, 1997. (9-12)  
Having fallen for a human boy, a beautiful teenage werewolf must battle both her packmates and the fear of the townspeople to decide where she belongs and with whom.

Klaus, Annette Curtis. *The Silver Kiss*. Delacorte Press, 1990. (7-12)  
A mysterious teenage boy harboring a dark secret helps Zoe come to terms with her mother's terminal illness.

Knight, Mary-Jane. *Vampyre: The Terrifying Lost Journal of Dr. Cornelius Van Helsing and Gustav de Wolff, his trusted companion*. HarperCollins, 2007. (5-9)  
Presents the journal of Dr. Cornelius Van Helsing; detailing what he has learned about vampires and providing lift-the-flaps, fold-out pages, envelopes, and hidden messages that include additional information.

Lanagan, Mardo. *Red Spikes* Knopf, 2007. (10-12)  
A collection of ten short stories about the supernatural and interpersonal relationships.. Includes Baby Jane -- Monkey's paternoster -- A good heart -- Winkie -- A feather in the breast of God -- Hero Vale -- Under hell, over heaven -- Mouse maker -- Forever upward -- Daughter of the clay.

Leavitt, Martine. *Keturah and Lord Death*. Front Street, 2006. (7-12)  
When Lord Death comes to claim sixteen-year-old Keturah while she is lost in the King's Forest, she charms him with her story and is granted a twenty-four hour reprieve in which to seek her one true love.

Levithan, David. *Marly's Ghost*. Speak, 2007, 2006. (7-12)  
The spirit of Ben's girlfriend, Marly, returns with three other ghosts to haunt him with a painful journey through Valentine's Days past, present, and future.

Link, Keely. *Pretty Monsters*. Viking, 2008. (8-12)  
A collection of monster stories that invite a closer examination of the truth. Each story involves a twist, supernatural or otherwise. From wizards, to worlds that exist inside purses, to aliens, the reader can never seem to get one step ahead of Link's point of view, which is somewhat reminiscent of the old Twilight Zone television show. The stories do not always wrap up nicely, but rather are open ended and invite the reader to speculate and choose the ending that they see fit. Includes The wrong grave -- The wizards of Perfl -- Magic for beginners -- The faery handbag -- The specialist's hat -- Monster -- The surfer -- The constable of Abal.

Lowry, Lois. *Gossamer*. Houghton Mifflin, 2006 (5-9)

While learning to bestow dreams, a young dream giver tries to save an eight-year-old boy from the effects of both his abusive past and the nightmares inflicted on him by the frightening Sinisteads.

Marr, Melissa. *Wicked Lovely*. HarperTeen, 2007. (9-12)

Seventeen-year-old Aislinn, who has the rare ability to see fairies, is drawn against her will into a centuries-old battle by Keenan, the terrifying but alluring Summer King, who determines that she must become his queen and save summer from perishing. Sequel is *Ink Exchange* (2008) and *Fragile Eternal* (2009).

Marr, Melissa. *Wicked lovely : desert tales.1, Sanctuary*. TokyoPop, 2009.

Finally free of Keenan and the schemes of the Faerie Courts, Rika, a fairy who used to be mortal, has isolated herself in the desert, where she becomes attracted to a mortal named Jayce. First volume in a manga trilogy linked to Marr's novels *Wicked Lovely*, *Ink Exchange* and *Fragile Eternity*.

Marsh, Katherine. *The Night Tourist*. Hyperion Books for Children, 2007. (6-10)

Fourteen-year-old Jack Perdu, a prodigy of classical mythology, suffers a near-fatal accident after which he meets Euri, a young ghost who introduces him to New York's ghostly underworld, eight levels below Grand Central Station, where he decides to look for his mother who disappeared years earlier.

Mead, Rachele. *Vampire Academy Series*. Razorbill. (10-12)

Two years after a horrible incident made them run away, vampire princess Lissa and her guardian-in-training Rose are found and returned to St. Vladimir's Academy, where one focuses on mastering magic, the other on physical training, while both try to avoid the perils of gossip, cliques, gruesome pranks, and sinister plots. Includes *Vampire Academy* (2007), *Frostbite* (2008), *Shadowkiss* (2008) and *Blood Promise* (2009).

Meehl, Brian. *Suck it Up*. Delacorte Press, 2008. (7-12)

After graduating from the International Vampire League, a scrawny, teenaged vampire named Morning is given the chance to fulfill his childhood dream of becoming a superhero when he embarks on a League mission to become the first vampire to reveal his identity to humans and to demonstrate how peacefully-evolved, blood-substitute-drinking vampires can use their powers to help humanity.

Mercer, Sienna. *Switched*. HarperTrophy, 2007. (4-8)

Upon moving to Franklin Grove, eighth-grader Olivia Abbott, a pink-loving cheerleader, learns that she has a twin sister, Ivy Vega, whose "goth" appearance hides a weird secret that prevents the girls from switching identities and performing normal twin pranks. Part of the *My Sister the Vampire* collection. Sequels include *Fangtastic*, *Re-Vamped* and *Vampalicious*.

Meyer, Stephenie. *Twilight Series*. Little Brown. (7-12)

Follows the experiences of Bella Swan, a young woman who moves to Forks, Washington, and becomes caught up in the lives of the handsome vampire, Edward Cullen, and Jake, a werewolf. Includes *Twilight* (2005), *New Moon* (2006), *Eclipse* (2007) and *Breaking Dawn* (2008).

Mignola, Michael. *Baltimore, or, The Steadfast Tin Soldier and the Vampire*. Bantam Books, 2007. (10-12)

On the battlefields of World War I, Lord Henry Baltimore awakens the wrath of a vampire, unleashing a violent plague that leaves Baltimore fighting a battle against evil and relying on the aid of three friends whose experiences have shown them that evil is devouring the world around them.

Mancusi, Marianne. *Boys that Bite*. Berkley Jam Books, 2006. (10-12)

Due to a case of mistaken identity, Sunshine McDonald is bitten by a good looking vampire and must find a way to reverse the vampire curse before she becomes one of the undead for the rest of time.

Mancusi, Marianne. *Girls that Growl*. Berkley Jam Books, 2007. (10-12)

Rayne McDonald, a goth vampire and vampire slayer, must go undercover as a cheerleader at her high school to find out what happened to the captain of the football team, who has disappeared, and to see if the peppy cheerleaders are really werewolves.

Miller, Martin. *Lonely Werewolf Girl*. Soft Skull Press, 2008. (9-12)

Teenage werewolf Kalix MacRinnalch is pursued through the streets of London by hunters armed with silver bullets, while her sister, the Werewolf Enchantress, is busy designing clothes for the Fire Queen and, in the Scottish Highlands, a feud is brewing

Moser, Barry, ill. *Scary Stories*. Chronicle Books, 2006.

Features a collection of horror stories by a number of noted authors including Edgar Allan Poe, O. Henry, Bram Stoker, Washington Irving, H. P. Lovecraft, Ambrose Bierce, and H.G. Wells Kittens / by Dean Koontz -- The Magic Shop / by H.G. Wells -- Miriam / by Truman Capote -- The tell-tale heart / by Edgar Allan Poe -- Genesis and catastrophe (a true story) / by Roald Dahl -- The squaw / by Bram Stoker -- Here there be tygers / by Stephen King -- Man overboard! / by Winston Churchill -- The lottery / by Shirley Jackson -- The bus-conductor / by E.F. Nix, Garth. *Abhorsen Trilogy Series*. Eos/HarperCollins. (7-12)

Thrilling tales of necromancers, mythical creatures, magical bells, and power over evil. Includes *Sabriel* (1995), *Lirael* (2001), and *Abhorsen* (2003).

Noel, Alyson. *Immortals Series*. St. Martin's Griffin, 2009. (8-12)

Since the car accident that claimed the lives of her family, sixteen-year-old Ever can see auras and hear people's thoughts, and she goes out of her way to hide from other people until she meets Damen, another psychic teenager who is hiding even more mysteries. First book is titled *Evermore* (2009) and sequel is *Blue Moon* (2009)

Noyes, Deborah.ed. *Gothic! : Ten Original Dark Tales*. Candlewick Press, 2006, 2004. (8-12)

Presents ten original stories of vampires, ghosts, witches, and sorcerers, including selections from Joan Aiken, Neil Gaiman, Gregory Maguire, and others  
Lungewater / Joan Aiken -- Morgan Roehmar's boys / Vivian Vande Velde -- Watch and wake / M.T. Perez, Marlene. *Dead is the New Black*. Harcourt, 2008. (6-10)

Seventeen-year-old Daisy Giordano, daughter and sister of psychics, attempts to help her mother discover who is behind a series of bizarre attacks on teenage girls in their little town of Nightshade, California. Sequels *Dead is a State of Mind* (2009), *Dead is so Last Year* (2009), *Dead is Just a Rumor* (Fall 2010) and *Dead is not an Option* (Spring 2011).

Price, Charlie. *The Dead Connection*. Roaring Brook Press, 2006 (8 -12)

Teen detectives Salt and Pepper embark on an exciting and dangerous trip to Alaska in order to retrieve a sacred vampire book that has been hidden in the land of the midnight sun.

Rees, Douglas. *Vampire High*. Dell Laurel-Leaf, 2005, 2003. (6-10)  
When his family moves from California to New Sodom, Massachusetts and Cody enters Vlad Dracul Magnet School, many things seem strange, from the dark-haired, pale-skinned, supernaturally strong students to Charon, the wolf who guides him around campus on the first day.

Reger, Rob. *Emily the Strange*. Dark Horse Comics. (10-12)

Hilariously spooky adventures about Araminta Spookie and her wacky family and friends. Includes *My Haunted House* (2006), *The Sword in the Grotto* (2006), *Frognapped* (2007), *Vampire Brat* (2007) & *Ghost Sitters* (2008).

Schrieber, Ellen. *Vampire Kisses Series*. HarperTeen. (6-10)  
Sixteen-year-old Raven, an outcast who always wears black and hopes to become a vampire some day, falls in love with the mysterious new boy in town, eager to find out if he can make her dreams come true. Includes *Vampire Kisses*(2003), *Kissing Coffins* (2005), *Vampireville* (2006) *Dance with a Vampire* (2007), *The Coffin Club* (2008) and *Royal Blood* (2010)

Two vampire brothers find their bond torn apart by the woman they both love and the tragedies of their past. Includes *Volume 1 & 2 – The Awakening/The Struggle*, *Volume 3 & 4 – The Fury/Dark Reunion (1993)*, *Volume 5 & 6 – The Return/Nightfall (2008)* and *Volume 7 & 8 – The Return/Shadow Souls (2010)*.

Smith, L. J. *Night World Series*. Simon Pulse, 2008. (10-12)

Contains three novels by L.J. Smith. "Secret Vampire," in which Poppy asks her secret lover James to make her immortal after being diagnosed with terminal cancer, "Daughters of Darkness," that describes the lives of three vampire sisters, and "Spellbinder" in which two witch cousins fight over their high school crush.
