### Merilee's Melodies: A Treasure Chest of Jewish Songwriters

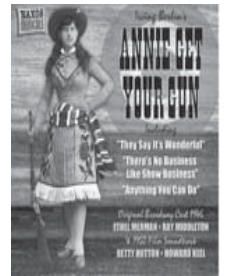
