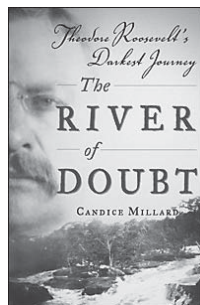
## National Library Week April 11-17

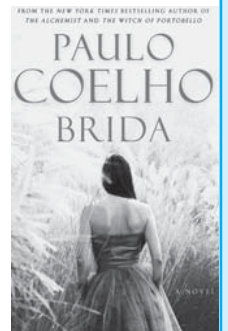

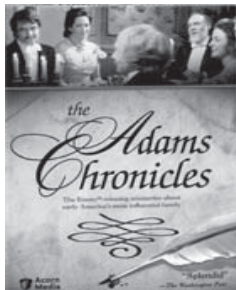

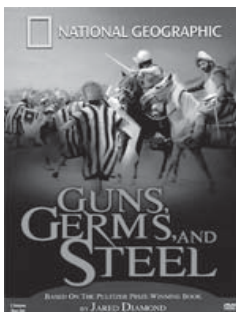
