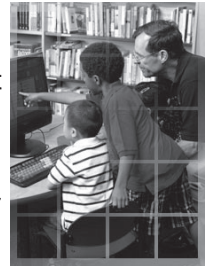

EARLY LITERACY STATION

We have acquired a new and different computer for our Children's Room. The Early Literacy Station is an exciting and motivating learning tool for children ages 2-10. It is self-contained and not connected to the Internet. The computer has 70 educational software packages, which include a combination of English, Spanish and bilingual Spanish packages. The educational titles in each curriculum area are carefully chosen for age appropriateness, educational value, ease of use, entertainment value, discovery and growth. Parents can also download 150 safe websites onto their own flashdrives, which can then be taken home and used on their computers. A fun way for children to understand the world!

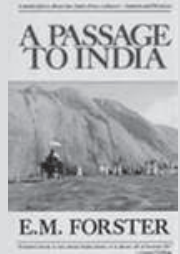

MONDAY, JULY 12 AT 7 PM

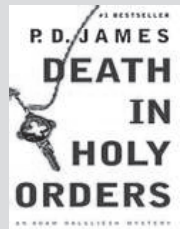

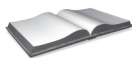
A SINGLE MAN

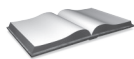

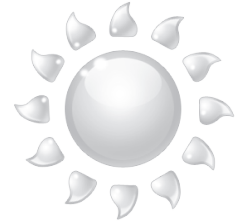
