AED/CPR TRAINING

The North Bellmore Public Library will offer AED/CPR training on March 6, 2012 10am-1pm. Knowing how to perform CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) on a loved one or friend stricken with cardiac arrest can double that person's chance of survival, according to the American Heart Association. An **automated external defibrillator** or **AED** is a [portable electronic device](#) that automatically diagnoses the potentially life threatening cardiac [arrhythmias](#) of [ventricular fibrillation](#) and [ventricular tachycardia](#) in a [patient](#), and is able to treat them through [defibrillation](#), the application of electrical therapy which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. The cost per patron is \$25-please sign up at the Reference desk.

BOOK DISCUSSION

Monday, February 13th 1:30-2:30PM

Dreams of Joy by Lisa See

See's *Dreams of Joy* picks up the story of sisters Pearl and May where *Shanghai Girls* left off: on the night in 1957 when Pearl's daughter, Joy, discovers that May is her true mother. While *Shanghai Girls* followed the sisters from their time as models in the glittering "Paris of Asia" to their escape from the Japanese invasion and their new life in Los Angeles, its sequel sends Pearl back to Shanghai twenty years later in pursuit of Joy, whose flight to China is propelled by anger, idealism, and a desire to find her true father, Z.G., an artist who may be falling out of favor with the Party. Joy goes with him deep into the countryside to the Green Dragon commune, where they take part in the energetic inception of Mao's Great Leap Forward. But their collective dream of a communist paradise is soon overshadowed by hunger as the government's bizarre agricultural mandates create a massive, relentless famine. Pearl, trapped in Shanghai as travel restrictions tighten, has little idea of the hardship Joy endures--until both women realize they must subvert a corrupt system in order to survive.

February 15, 2012 **Moneyball**

Based on a true story, *Moneyball* is a movie for anybody who has ever dreamed of taking on the system. Brad Pitt stars as Billy Beane, the general manager of the Oakland A's and the guy who assembles the team, who has an epiphany: all of baseball's conventional wisdom is wrong. Forced to reinvent his team on a tight budget, Beane will have to outsmart the richer clubs. The onetime jock teams with Ivy League grad Peter Brand (Jonah Hill) in an unlikely partnership, recruiting bargain players that the scouts call flawed, but all of whom have an ability to get on base, score runs, and win games. NEW YORK STATE Requirements- Persons required to complete the course

- You operate a personal watercraft (regardless of age, you must complete the course).

- Youth Operators - Required to Complete the Course

If you wish to operate a motorboat independently and are between the ages of 10 and 18 years of age, you must hold a boating safety certificate (complete one of our courses listed). If you are less than 10 years old you may operate a motorboat (non-PWC) only if someone over 18 or someone between the ages of 10 and 18 who holds a safety certificate, is on board with you. Anyone may operate a personal watercraft if someone at least 18 years old is riding on the craft and they hold a safety certificate.

NEW YORK STATE - Personal Watercraft - Minimum Age of Operation

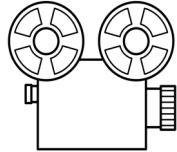
Amended NYS law which took effect January 1, 2006 raised the minimum age of operators of PWC to fourteen (14). As of January 1, 2009, PWC Operators must be 14 years of age to operate a Personal Watercraft.
