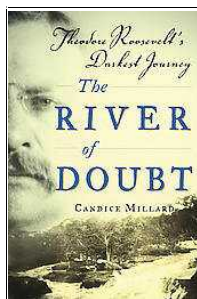

LIBRARY LOBBY DAY

A large contingent of Long Islanders made the trip to Albany this year for Library Day on March 2, 2010. NCLA was represented by approximately 70 individuals with a strong group of Library Friends and other library supporters joining our advocacy team and traveling to Albany in one of the 2 NCLA-sponsored buses that made the day-long trip.

In addition, a number of members (especially library directors) traveled to Albany on Monday, March 1st to attend meetings in Albany, a fund-raiser and to be on hand to greet and speak to our legislators when they came to the Legislative Reception hosted by NYLA that began the day's activities.

In addition, a number of NCLA members were on the SCLA buses and they joined our group when we reached the Capitol. Kudos to Ken Bellafiore and Elizabeth Olesh for their work in organizing the bus trips and making sure that all the participants came back to the Island in good spirits!

Participation in this year's Day was excellent. A "rally" in Meeting Room 6 of the Empire State Plaza was attended by most of the more than 1000 individuals who registered at the NYLA desk. Speakers included NYLA's Legislative Com-

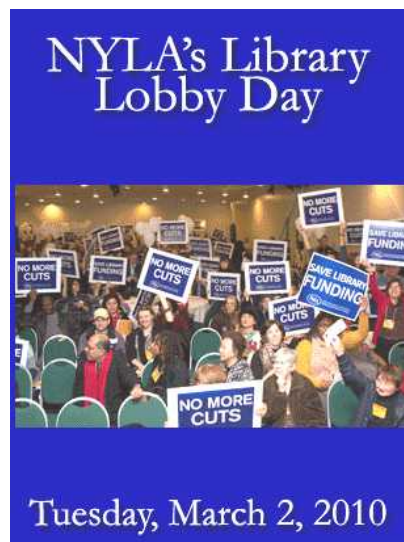
mittee Chair, Kevin Verbese (SCLS), as well as Senators Hugh Farley (a legislator who has been the prime Senate sponsor of all library legislation for more than 30 years) and Long Island Senator John Flanagan, Assemblywomen Barbara Lifton (Chair, Library Committee), and author/musician Da Chen. State Library Director Bernard Margolies, Queens Library Director Tom Galante, Brooklyn Public Library Director Dionne Mack-Harvin also offered encouraging words and additional facts for us to consider. This event certainly impressed the legislators who attended and we trust that they brought a report of our concerns and energy back to their conferences.

For the second consecutive year, the weather throughout our trip was excellent, although the Legislators did not make our outlook brighter as they recounted the woes of the fiscal crisis facing the State. Our team made its case and we hope that good policy judgments will prevail as the budget-making process continues towards resolution.

We also know that ALL Library Advocates must continue pressing our case for an adequate allocation of NYS resources to maintain our systems and the services that libraries provide. I remind all members, and their friends, colleagues, neighbors and other family members, that speaking to legislators about library issues should be an ongoing activity. It is never too soon

to discuss the need for additional library support.

Traveling East or West on Southern State Parkway: Leave the Parkway at Exit 23, Meadowbrook Rd. Turn northbound on Meadowbrook Rd. (left, if traveling west; right if traveling east). Stay in left lane; go a short distance to main intersection, which is Jerusalem Ave. Turn left; NLS is about 1 mile on left.

LIBRARY BRIEFS



In celebration of Valentine's Day, *Locust Valley Library* Director, Janis Schoen, hired a group from the International Barbershop Harmony Society to come and serenade the staff. The money it cost went to various charities that the Society sponsors. A fun time was had by staff and patrons alike.

The *Port Washington Public Library* is proud to announce that it is the recipient of a National Endowment for the Humanities Preservation Assessment Grant, which is designed to help educational and cultural institutions improve their ability to preserve and care for humanities collections. Thanks to Port Washington residents, who have individually donated thousands of pages of manuscripts and photographs to the library since 1892, the library's archival collection is impressive. This grant will provide outside expertise and special classes for staff to improve their abilities in the care and handling of rare and fragile historic library materials to ensure that the collection is

safe and organized into the future. Eilly Shodell, the library's director of local history, was informed that the grant has been designated a National Endowment for the Humanities "We the People" project and is being supported in part by funds the agency has set aside for this special initiative. Library Director Nancy Curtin announced the award and noted that the application process included peer review and specialist review along with deliberation by the National Council on the Humanities and the Office of the Chairman.

The Huntington Arts Council and the New York State Council on the Arts announced the winners of the 2010 Long Island Decentralization Grants for the Arts at its 13th Annual DEC Awards Reception on Thursday, February 25, 2010, at the Walt Whitman Birthplace in Huntington Station. 2010 Awardees included the following Nassau libraries: *Baldwin Public Library, Henry Waldinger Memorial Library, Hewlett-Woodmere Public Library, Hillside Public Library, Long Beach Public Library, and the Lynbrook Public Library.*



The *Henry Waldinger Memorial Library* has received a 2010 grant from the Long Island Fund for Women & Girls to present "Empowering Women and Girls for Success," a series of workshops aimed at giving women and girls an edge in the competitive job market in these tough financial times. "Teen to Women Economic Empowerment" and "Leaping from Passion to Career Opportunity" will be presented by Certified Executive Coach Denecia Marshall. "Tweens - Be Confident! Be Motivated! Be YOU!" will feature Brittany and Terri MacLeod, co-authors of *113 Things to Do by 13*, and Certified Beauty & Image Consultant Rebecca Kopcienski will present "Creating a Professional

Image." Programs are scheduled for April 2010 and are open to all teen girls and women. The Long Island Fund for Women and Girls funds programs that improve the lives of women and girls, highlights and addresses women's issues, and develops women's philanthropy.

The *Friends of the Rockville Centre Public Library* held an afternoon program with popular author Adriana Trigiani on Sunday, March 14, 2010, at the South Side High School. It was a fun and entertaining afternoon, with book signings and raffles. Ticket proceeds went to the Friends of the Library.



Garden City Public Library hosted a capacity crowd at its program, "All About Forgetfulness/Maintain Your Brain," on Tuesday, March 2, 2010. The Long Island Alzheimer's Foundation, based in Port Washington, presented the program which drew a capacity crowd of Garden City residents as well as attendees from throughout Long Island. Virginia Belling, the representative from the Alzheimer's organization, discussed what is normal when it comes to "forgetting" and "remembering" as well as how we age. Ms. Belling suggested exercises to "maintain your brain". In addition, the group learned about the reversible causes of memory loss as well as the importance of recognizing the early warning signs of Alzheimer's and getting an early diagnosis.
