

MUSEUM PASS PROGRAM

1. Free Museum Passes are available to Plainedge School District residents who hold a Plainedge Public Library card in good standing and who have signed the Museum Pass User Agreement.
2. Museum Passes may be reserved for the current or following month, subject to availability and must be handled by an adult (18 years or older). **All reserves will be taken only in person at the Reference Desk.**
3. A maximum of one pass per family may be borrowed at one time and each individual Museum pass may be borrowed only once a month.
4. Passes may be borrowed for 3 days and must be returned to the Library no later than one hour before closing on the due date. Passes may not be returned in the book drop.
5. To ensure that a Museum Pass can be given to the next patron, there is a \$10.00 late fee per day.
6. In the event that non-return of a Museum Pass necessitates the Library to pay the entrance fee for the next user, that entry fee to that Museum will be attached to the borrower's record.
7. Any user who loses a Museum Pass will be charged the replacement cost of that Museum Pass. (See Reference for cost of replacement).
8. The Library staff reserves the right to monitor usage to ensure fair access for the greatest number of patrons.
9. It is the responsibility of the user to telephone or check the Museum website in advance for information on hours of operation, parking and/or direction.
